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#### **Editorial**

This newsletter is the Library and Knowledge Services's channel to keep you posted on various issues relevant to you.

In this issue we highlight the transition of the former PCTs Library and Knowledge Services to a shared service under the Directorate of Quality and Nursing following organisational changes in July 2011.

- The Library Annual Report also shows there was increase is book borrowing and document supply by staff from both PCTs. There was also continued use of other library and knowledge services.
- Training continues as a key strategy to enable staff to find the most relevant information in support of evidence-based practice.
- o Knowledge management initiatives by Library and Knowledge Services currently focus on written evidence. In response to user needs, a tailored service continues to be developed using web technology available to the public domain. We encourage you to subscribe to your subject interests and give us feedback on ways to improve the knowledge centres.
- The Library Management Board provides a link with users and senior management across the partner organisations.



- The Library continues to keep the book stock on subjects of relevance to your practice up-to-date. Included in this newsletter is a list of books recently added to the library catalogue.
- The Ask a Librarian service calls for you to contact them for help finding the best available evidence at the earliest opportunity to save time and speed delivery of your services.

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### **Library Annual Report 2010-11**

The last PCTs Library and Knowledge Services Annual Report for 2010-11 is now available on request. It will however be uploaded on the staff zone website in October.

Highlights of the report include:

- Athens registrations 154 new users
- New books 297 added
- Document supply 475 requests
- Out of hours access increase in numbers
- Book loans increased borrowing by both SCPCT and TWPCT
- Finding the Evidence training –booking system is now centrally administered resulting in increased uptake.
- Immunisation hub has over 120 subscribers and will be evaluated during the year.

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### **Knowledge Centres**

The Library and Knowledge Service is exploring further the provision of relevant and up-to-date health information to support evidence-based practice. The creation of subject specific knowledge centres is seen as one way to keep you up-to-date without overloading you with too much information.

The current awareness service on a few subjects has been piloted for over a year. We are augmenting the subject areas into Knowledge Centres using Netvibes web technology. The initial Knowledge Centres will cover:
