She lectures both nationally and internationally and has written many papers concerning the prevention and management of incontinence. Her very first paper 'The Catheter of Choice' was written in 1980 when she was working as a research sister, showing her early interest in catheter management. Janet is a founder member of the Association for Continence Advice. She established the first nurse led clinics for incontinence in the UK and set up continence services in three Primary Care Trusts.

She is currently the Clinical Nurse Advisor for the 21st Century Catheter Project (21CCP - http://21ccp.org/), which was established in conjunction with the Bladder and Bowel Foundation to highlight the unresolved needs in this field of healthcare and also provide help and support to those who regularly use urinary catheters. Janet has been self-employed for the past 20 years working as an independent nursing consultant for the promotion of continence.

Hydration

Naomi Campbell Hydration Lead Nurse, Peninsula Community Health

Naomi is Hydration Lead Nurse for Peninsula Community Health, a not-for-profit community interest company delivering NHS adult community health services in Cornwall and Isles of Scilly.



Naomi has developed a range of prototypes designed to enhance hydration care across elderly care whilst also raising awareness around the daily challenges of trying to ensure vulnerable patients have enough to drink. These include:

- a new hands free drinking aid that enables frail bedridden patients to independently sip fluids
- a tea cup which enables staff to more easily monitor how much has been consumed
- a new risk assessment tool designed to be used by any carer to systematically identify the level of support patients may need to drink or eat
- a new video training pack to raise greater awareness about dehydration

The project has attracted national interest and has been included in leading nursing journals and other conference presentations.
