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Protocol for the administration of GLYCERYL TRINITRATE SPRAY (GTN) 400 microg/dose

to patients in Minor Injury Units by registered nurses, pharmacists or paramedics

1. Staff competencies	
Authorised staff	Registered general nurse, pharmacist or paramedic
Additional requirements	Evidence of ongoing CPD and satisfactory completion of competency assessment by clinical manager Awareness of medicines containing nitrates and access to standard reference sources Onus on clinical manager for induction of new staff

2. Clinical condition or situation		
Clinical situation	Treatment of Angina/Acute non-traumatic Chest Pain	
Patients included	Patients presenting with angina	
Patients excluded	 Hypersensitivity to any of the ingredients of the preparation or on interacting or contraindicated drugs (see SPC <u>www.medicines.org.uk</u>) Heart rate <50 or >150 beats per minute Systolic BP less than 100mm Hg Acute CVA Head trauma Any vasodilator drug (including drugs such as Viagra (sildenafil)) in the previous 24 hours Patient intoxicated Acute circulatory shock including hypovolaemic shock. 	
Action for patients excluded	Contact doctor for advice or 999	
Action if patient declines	Contact doctor for advice or 999	

3. Description of treatment	
Medicine to be administered	glyceryl trinitrate (GTN) sublingual spray 400microg per dose
Dose schedule	 Adults only: one or two doses to be sprayed under the tongue and then patient directed to close the mouth. Check BP. May be repeated twice at 5 minute intervals if symptoms do not receive.
	 May be repeated twice at 5 minute intervals if symptoms do not resolve providing systolic BP is >100mmHg.
Follow up	Monitor patient.
	Any lack of effect may be an indicator of early myocardial infarction
Patient advice	Inform the patient that the medicine is being administered under a protocol
	Inform patient of common side effects e.g. dizziness, postural hypotension,
	tachycardia and throbbing headache
Record keeping	Reason for administration and doses administered must be recorded on the electronic record
